It will try to figure out an alternate route to get you where you need to be. Sometimes in our Spiritual lives, we need to recalculate how to get back on the path that God has for us.

I don't like high-pressure sales. You ever deal with one of those time-share reps? Those guys just will not take 'no' for an answer. I don't want to pressure you. If you are seeking God, then, man, do I want to hang out with you. If you're not seeking God, then I still want to hang out with you, but maybe to get coffee or go fishing.

Finally, church, I just want to say, "Pursue Jesus."
