Strong's Concordance defines hospitality (φιλοξενία-G5381) as:

1) love to strangers, hospitality

This message has three parts:

- 1. God's Hospitality.
- 2. Who is the stranger?
- 3. Given to Hospitality.

God's Hospitality.

Luke 14:15-24 *compel them to come in*

God's hospitality is open to all, the only problem is you have to show up! I can invite you to dinner all I want but if you're not willing to even come then you're refusing my hospitality.

God's invitation has been open to all for over two thousand years! The price was paid in full at Calgary! Yet people refuse Him and His hospitality!

Isaiah 55:1-3 come ye, buy, and eat

The table has been set, God's hospitality is open. And when you accept His hospitality He makes a covenant with you or an agreement with you.

Hebrews 10: 16-22 This is the covenant that I will make with them

1 John 5:8 the Spirit, and the water, and the blood

Who is the stranger?

Matthew 25: 31-40 (Jesus speaking) I was a stranger, and ye took me in

When you're doing hospitality to the stranger you're taking them in, sharing that covenant that God made with you, so the goal is to see them saved.

Acts 18: 24-26 they took him unto them

Romans 12: 10-13 given to hospitality.

1 Peter 4: 8-10 Use hospitality one to another without grudging.

Luke 7:36-47 *alabaster box of ointment*
